10 Ice Cream Fun Facts

- ~More than 90% of US households purchase ice cream.

 ~The ice cream industry generates more than \$21 billion in annual sales.
- ~Americans consumed about 1.53 billion gallons of ice cream and frozen products in 2011.
- ~On average, people in the US eat 48 pints of ice cream per person, per year. This is more than any other country.
- ~According to a survey of ice cream retailers, vanilla is by far the most popular flavor sold in the US, accounting for 20-29% of sales. Chocolate is a distant second.
- ~80% of the world's vanilla beans used for ice cream are grown in Madagascar.
- ~It takes 12 pounds of milk to make 1 gallon of ice cream.
 ~Ice cream became popular in the the US after the
 American Revolution. Thomas Jefferson served as US
 Ambassador in France and was very fond of it. In fact, the
 Library of Congress has a recipe for vanilla ice cream
 that was hand written by Jefferson!
- ~Immigrants at Ellis Island were given vanilla ice cream as part of their "Welcome to America" meal.
- ~The ice cream cone was reportedly invented during the 1904 World's Fair in St. Louis when an ice cream vendor ran out of bowls and teamed up with a waffle vendor to make cones.

work, but we look forward to a great tour next spring.
























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
