With no other business to conduct, Jack asked for a motion to adjourn. Tommy and Cristy made the motions, and the meeting was closed at 7:56 pm.



1992. The Coupe is now taken care of by one of Cheryl's niece's in Kentucky, but the Touring is Cheryl's car.

Cheryl and I have toured in the car in Missouri, Arkansas, California, North Carolina, Wisconsin, West Virginia, Virginia and Canada.
